Re-Entry services include community-based outreach, mental health & substance abuse treatment referrals, case management and other support services, and housing services.

### **Services**

- ◆ Onsite Narcotics and Alcoholic Anonymous (NA/AA) meetings 9:30am to 11:30am and 2:00pm to 3:00pm
- ◆ Medication packaging and distribution by onsite personnel via a partnership with Kirkwood Pharmacy
- ◆ Recovery Maintenance Support; Counseling; Case-Management; Transitional Housing
- ◆ Computer Lab & Library; Hospital Visitation Program; Clothing Closet & Pantry
- ◆ Housing & Employment Skills Assistance; Pre-Hospital Discharge Planning
- ◆ Accompaniment to Mental Health Court and other appointments
- ◆ A Warm Line with 24/7 response capability; Peer Support; Access to email
- ◆ Personal Storage Units; Haircuts; Washer/dryer; Mail Service; Telephone use
- ◆ Social recreational activities such as field trips to movies, bowling and in-house activities
- ◆ Medical & Psychiatric Nurse Practitioners On-Site
- ◆ Public assistance including food stamps, Section 8, LIHEAP (energy costs)
- ◆ Transportation assistance including para-transit
- ◆ Access to legal aid and connections to the public defender's office
- ◆ Housing assistance
- ◆ Volunteer opportunities and activities in the community
- ◆ Literacy and continuing education
- ◆ Job training and placement through the department of Vocational Rehabilitation
- ◆ Links to mental health providers
